Who was Dixie Jackson and why is our missions offering named after her?

In 1914, Mrs. Dixie Jackson accepted a full-time position with the Arkansas chapter of the Woman's Missionary Union (WMU). Her greatest fulfillment in this job came from traveling the state, training women, and spreading the word about Arkansas Baptist missions efforts.

In 1926, she enlisted the help of the state WMU president to establish a Week of Prayer for Arkansas state missions. Before Dixie Jackson passed away from an illness in early 1929, she had the privilege of seeing an offering added to the third annual Week of Prayer, with more than \$1,000 being collected to aid missions projects statewide.

In 1935, the annual offering was named in memory of this incredible woman. In 2023, the offering named in her honor collected \$1.874 million to aid missions projects statewide.
